Hobie Autobiography: A Personal Note from Blaine Dodds

I was born and raised on the East Cape Coast of South Africa.

My father purchased a Hobie 14 in the 1970's. This was an era of surf, sailing, sun and just having fun.

I remember sailing out through huge waves and surfing them in again. If you did not master the art of boat handling very quickly, you were bound to break a mast.

During my teen years I started competitive racing, there was a very strong Hobie 14 fleet. I grew accustomed to sailing in adverse weather conditions with high winds and big seas, chop and currents.

I was fortunate at this time to sail almost every Saturday and Sunday, giving me an excellent grounding for my racing career later on.

In 1978 I joined the SA navy, based in Cape Town. They were very lenient and gave me time off to follow my Hobie dreams. Those were the years that I started racing Hobie 16's with Shaun Ferry as my crew.

I started competing internationally and got a taste of the real Hobie way of life, meeting up with friends at exotic places and generally having fun on and off the water.

In Virgin Islands and Tahiti, we achieved two 2^{nd} positions. Shaun and I were very satisfied and encouraged with these results.

After completing my Navy training I moved to Plettenberg Bay and joined my parents business. I married the love of my life "June" and started my family.

From 1990 – 2002 Steve Arnold was my crew. We honed our skills together and competed successfully all over the world in the Hobie 16's.

We attended 9 World events achieving a 1^{st} , two $2^{nd's}$ and the remainder under 10^{th} position.

When my daughter Roxanne turned 13 yrs old she became my permanent Hobie 16 crew and she still is today.

Together we won numerous Hobie 16 SA Nationals, competed in four World Championships and excelled mainly in the Masters Category obtaining two 1^{st} 's & two 2^{nds} . This was a very special time of my life as it afforded me time to bond with my young daughter.

In 2004 I started sailing Hobie Tigers with my son Peter. Winning eight SA Nationals, competing in four World Championships and placing 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 9^{th} in the process. We also enjoyed competing in International Raids winning all of them so far. It has been a privilege to share these special times with my son as I had done with my daughter.

During the last 45 years of sailing competitively, I am very thankful to my various crews for their friendship, fun and hard work during all these events. Namely Shaun Ferry, Steve Arnold, my daughter Roxanne and son Peter and especially my lovely wife June, the Pit crew for support keeping the family together, seeing to meals and of course the beers.
